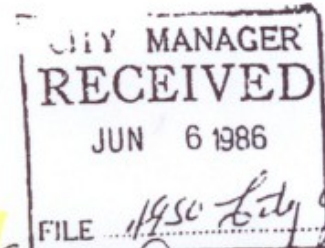

It has come to the Department's attention that significant levels of hydrocarbon and heavy metals contamination at the above site, formerly the Imperial Oil Refinery, have been confirmed by recent test hole drilling. Test hole data confirms contamination to depths of greater than six meters in some test holes.

As this site overlies the Regina aquifer it could be a significant point source of contamination. A careful review of existing data and evaluation of further data needs should be undertaken to determine required mitigative work.

We would appreciate receiving, at your earliest convenience, copies of available investigation reports and background information so that we may undertake a more comprehensive review of the situation.
