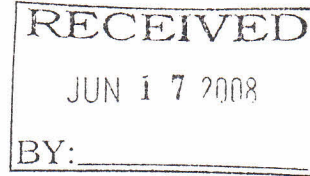

Dear Mr. Kimery:

The following is in response to your letter addressed to Mr. Ralph Bock dated May 28, 2008, that was also copied to Minister Heppner regarding the former Regina Imperial Oil Refinery property. Imperial Oil has been requested to submit the results of their Phase I Environmental Site Assessment to the Ministry of Environment by June 30, 2008. This timeline has been agreed to due to the substantial volume of documentation to potentially be reviewed.

Once Imperial Oil forwards their assessment to the ministry, officials will review the information and determine what follow up action or next steps will be required. This may entail detailed Phase II assessments and potentially development and implementation of corrective action plans. Your continued patience throughout this process is appreciated, as the ministry wants to ensure that as much information as possible is available to allow an appropriate response and direction for future action.

The ministry has reviewed the information available to date and has concluded that the land use is consistent with the level of risk. The additional information you have referenced will be of interest to the ministry and once the information for that area is reviewed, determination can be made as to whether any immediate action is required to be undertaken. Officials will arrange for an inspection of the area to determine whether the protruding pipes identified warrant immediate attention. If action is required the necessary discussions will commence to determine appropriate steps and responsibilities with City of Regina and Imperial Oil officials.


The Government of Saskatchewan delegates zoning to communities through The Planning and Development Act by declaring the municipality an "approving authority". The Government of Saskatchewan does not approve end land use or zoning in Regina. The Ministry of Environment is involved in the review of
